Rail 200 Event

Saturday saw the culmination of a very successful three-day event based around the Rail 200 Inspiration Train which was stabled at Boat of Garten during its stay. **Gordon Kirk reports:**

We sold almost **1,000 tickets** and generated income of nearly **£28,000**. The Rail200 Inspiration Train had over **930 visitors**.
